About the Medical Reserve Corps



The Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) units are community-based and function as a way to locally organize and utilize volunteers— medical professionals and others— who want to donate their time and expertise to promote healthy living throughout the year and to prepare for and respond to emergencies.

MRC volunteers supplement existing local community medical and emergency response systems.

MRC volunteers include medical and public health professionals such as physicians, nurses, pharmacists, dentists, veterinarians and epidemiologists. Other community members such as, interpreters, chaplains, office workers, and legal advisors, can fill other vital support functions.

What can MRC Volunteers Do?

<u>Support</u> Local Public Health initiatives and the goals of the Local and State Health Departments.

Assist local hospitals and health departments with surge personnel needs, on site or at a treatment location during an event's initial hours, before other help arrives

<u>Participate</u> in community preparedness activities, such as exercises for shelters, mass prophylaxis, vaccination clinics, and other emergency scenarios

Train with local emergency response partners
