Pledge of Allegiance

President Todd Thacker called the meeting to order at 5:00.

Calling of the roll

Present: Aaron Loudermilk, Nancy Allsup, Vicki Weger, Marie Theisz, Travis Norris, David Thompson, and Todd Thacker.

Correcting of the journal of the preceding meeting if needed

February 3, 2023 Special Call Committee Meeting February 7, 2023 Sunshine Meeting February 14, 2023 Meeting

There were no corrections to the minutes of the February 3, 2023 Special Call Committee Meeting. Marie Theisz made a motion to approve the minutes of the Special Call Committee Meeting. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

There were no corrections to the minutes of the February 7, 2023 Sunshine meeting. Travis Norris made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 7, 2023 Sunshine meeting. Marie Theisz seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

There were no corrections to the minutes of the February 14, 2023 meeting. Vicki Weger made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 14, 2023 meeting. Nancy Allsup seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

Public Comments

Keith Ketner of Terre Haute had comments about a conflict of interest.

Communications from elected officials, other officials or agencies of the County
Peyton Rowe and Logan Winslow from the Terre Haute North Engineering class that had
given a presentation at the Sunshine Meeting regarding their Winds of the Wabash
project were present for any additional questions. Marie Theisz explained that the
Council, as the financial body, can make a recommendation but it would probably take
the involvement of the Parks Department and possibly the Commissioners to accomplish
what the class would like to do. Peyton Rowe briefly reviewed their goal which was to
build a prototype that provides energy that could offset electric costs and was
environmentally safe. There was a short discussion. Marie Theisz made a motion to
show support for the Terre Haute North High School Engineering students moving

forward. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

Reports from committee(s)

Marie Theisz asked if there was a timeline on the appeals process for the Baker Tilly study. Kara Wright said that Jada Kent of Baker Tilly will be here on April 4, 5 and 6 to meet with any department heads that would like to meet. Kara Wright will arrange appointment times for those who wish to meet.

Resolutions and Ordinances other than appropriations.

i. Resolution of Reallocation 2023-04: Area Planning – Out-of-Series Transfer

This was presented at the Sunshine Meeting. Council had no further questions. Vicki Weger made a motion to approve this request. Travis Norris seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

ii. Resolution 2023-05: Expressing Interest in Real Estate and Appointing Appraisers: Commissioners

This was presented at the Sunshine Meeting. Council had no further questions. David Thompson made a motion to approve Resolution 2023-05. Aaron Loudermilk seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

iii. Resolution 2023-06: Resolution of the County Council of Vigo County, Indiana in Support of a Plan for Disbursement of American Rescue Plan Funds: Commissioners

This originally came before, and was approved by, the Council as an Ordinance but it was discovered that it should actually be submitted in the form of a resolution which is being done tonight. Commissioner Chris Switzer also distributed an updated Plan of Action to the Council. This sets forth the steps and requirements which will be needed in order to qualify for and receive ARPA funding. This was briefly reviewed and it was noted that this Resolution will approve the plan but requests for the actual appropriations for each group will still come before, and have to be approved by, the Council. Travis Norris made a motion to approve Resolution 2023-06. Marie Theisz seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

Ordinances relating to appropriations.

i. Salary Ordinance 2023-02; ROC 2023-01: Clerk – Salary Increases

County Clerk Brad Newman was present to answer any questions from Council. Vicki Weger made a motion to refer this to the Budget Committee and table the Ordinance until it is brought back before the full Council for the duration. Nancy Allsup seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

ii. Salary Ordinance 2023-03; ROC 2023-01: Clerk – delete part time positions and add full time positions

The Council had no further questions about this request. Vicki Weger made a motion to approve Salary Ordinance 2023-03. Travis Norris seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

iii. Salary Ordinance 2023-04; ROC 2023-01: Election Board – salary increases

Marie Theisz said this is one she feels should be adjusted but thinks it should be considered at budget meetings. Marie Theisz made a motion to refer this to the Budget Committee and table it until it is brought back before the full Council for the duration. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

iv. Salary Ordinance 2023-05; ROC 2023-04: Juvenile Justice Center - Salary Increases

There were no additional questions from Council. Vicki Weger made a motion to approve Salary Ordinance 2023-05. Nancy Allsup seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

v. Salary Ordinance 2023-06; ROC 2023-04: Juvenile Justice Center – Stipends & Retention Bonuses

Marie Theisz asked if this had also been done for the Jail. President Thacker indicated that these had been given to the jailers but not Juvenile Center employees. Travis Norris asked if the retention bonus was a 1-time bonus. Mr. Loudermilk said he was just asking for parity with what everybody else was getting. There was a short discussion. Vicki Weger made a motion to approve Salary Ordinance 2023-06. Nancy Allsup seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

vi. Salary Ordinance 2023-07; ROC 2023-06: Coroner Add Chief Deputy Coroner position

Vicki Weger reminded everyone that there had been a chief deputy coroner some time ago but after he retired, the position was never filled. There was a lengthy discussion. Travis Norris asked if the amount requested was the salary for the position or an increase in salary from what they currently made. Chief Deputy Auditor Cheryl Loudermilk confirmed that the amount requested was the annual salary for that position. Discussion continued. Vicki Weger made a motion to approve Salary Ordinance 2023-07. Travis Norris seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

vii. Additional Appropriation 2023-22; ROC 2023-09: Jail – Staff Increases

This is the appropriation to fund Salary Ordinance 2023-08 that was passed last month. Marie Theisz made a motion to approve Additional Appropriation 2023-22. Nancy Allsup seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote, there were six votes of aye with Aaron Loudermilk voting nay. With a vote of 6-1 in favor, the motion passed.

viii. Additional Appropriation 2023-23; ROC 2023-09: Sheriff – additional staff

This is the appropriation to fund Salary Ordinance 2023-09 that was passed last month. There was a brief discussion. Marie Theisz made a motion to approve Additional Appropriation 2023-23. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

ix. Salary Ordinance 2023-10; ROC 2023-09: Sheriff – add secretary position

This is a position that has been being paid from Jail funds but which, in actuality, should be paid from the Sheriff's budget. Doing this will result in a lower rate of pay. The individual currently in this position is aware of this and has agreed to it. This is not adding a position but is basically just cleaning up the situation and putting the position in the correct budget. Travis Norris asked if the position should be deleted in the Jail budget. The individual has been being paid as a jailer even though acting in a secretarial capacity. The moving of this individual will essentially just leave a jailer's position that can be filled. There was a short discussion. Vicki Weger made a motion to approve Salary Ordinance 2023-10. Nancy Allsup seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

x. Salary Ordinance 2023-11; ROC 2023-10: Prosecutor – Amend Deputy Prosecutor Base Salary

Rob Roberts, Chief Deputy Prosecutor, was present to answer any questions. Vicki Weger made a motion to refer this to the budget committee and table Salary Ordinance 2023-11 until it can be brought back to the full council. Nancy Allsup seconded the motion. Aaron Loudermilk asked what the timeline for that would be. There was a lengthy discussion. Aaron Loudermilk felt that this situation should be dealt with sooner than during the budget process due to the fact that there were many positions that the Prosecutor's Office could not fill and they were actually losing Deputy Prosecutors because the salary was too low. He had concerns that the number of Deputy Prosecutors might be decimated further if the base salary did not change before the budget process. President Thacker said that this would also be addressed in the Baker Tilly study and could possibly change the pay structure when that process concluded. David Thompson said he agreed with Councilman Loudermilk and thought this should be dealt with sooner rather than later. There was a very lengthy discussion about this matter. Mr. Roberts said that in talking with an attorney who had already left and the current attorney who would be leaving soon if a wage increase would make a difference. Both replied that it would and they would be willing to stay/come back. Council asked if documentation, such as exit interviews, could be provided to substantiate that information. Meetings with Baker Tilly should be concluded by the April meeting date and it was asked if this could be brought back up and discussed at the April meeting. The motion previously made and seconded was repeated before a vote was taken. Ms. Weger said the motion was to refer this to the budget committee for consideration and to table it until it is brought back to the full Council. Council Attorney Michael Wright clarified that any Council member has the ability to pull an item off the table that has been tabled at any time. If one of the Council members takes that step, he urged them to consider that at the Sunshine Meeting in order for the necessary paperwork to effectuate that decision could be prepared for the following meeting. Upon a roll call vote, voting was as follows:

Aaron Loudermilk – nay; Nancy Allsup – aye; Vicki Weger – aye; Marie Theisz – aye; Travis Norris – aye; David Thompson – nay; Todd Thacker – aye. By a vote of 5-2, the motion carried.

xi. Salary Ordinance 2023-12; ROC 2023-10: Prosecutor – Add Deputy Prosecutor Percentage Increase

Rob Roberts said that this request is ultimately in conjunction with the increase of the base salary and, based on the table of that prior request, asked that this request be treated the same. Vicki Weger made a motion to refer Salary Ordinance 2023-12 to the budget committee for consideration and to table it until it is brought back to the full Council. Nancy Allsup seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 6-1, with Aaron Loudermilk voting nay, the motion carried .

xii. Salary Ordinance 2023-13; ROC 2023-10: Prosecutor – Add Deputy Prosecutor Positions (3)

Vicki Weger made a motion to refer Salary Ordinance 2023-14 to the budget committee and to table it until it is brought back to the full Council. Nancy Allsup seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

xiii. Salary Ordinance 2023-14; ROC 2023-10: Prosecutor – Add 2 Legal Secretary Positions

Marie Theisz asked Mr. Roberts if one of these positions was for Community Service. Mr. Roberts said that Community Corrections had been responsible for both arranging locations for community service and monitoring those service hours. Someone needs to monitor compliance with the program in order for it to continue and Community Corrections will no longer be doing that. Somebody needs to monitor the compliance. He has contracted with someone to design a web portal that will allow whoever does this to keep track of the information. Managing this will probably not require a full time position but the individual would then have other duties in the office and this is for one of the positions in this request. The other individual requested is in conjunction with the additional staffing request. Mr. Roberts elaborated about what this would entail. There was a lengthy discussion. The question arose whether the Council could amend the motion to add one position instead of two and was discussed. Marie Theisz made a motion to amend Salary Ordinance 2023-14 to add one legal secretary position. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed. Vicki Weger made a motion to approve Salary Ordinance 2023-14, as amended. Marie Theisz seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

xiv. Additional Appropriation 2023-24; ROC 2023-11: Juvenile Court – Staff Increases

There was a brief discussion to clarify what this motion is for. This is the appropriation to fund Salary Ordinance 2023-1 that was passed last month regarding the CASA program. Marie Theisz made a motion to approve Additional Appropriation 2023-24. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved.

xv. Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2023-21: Seized Assets – New Equipment

Council had no further questions on this request. Vicki Weger made a motion to approve Additional Appropriation 2023-21. Nancy Allsup seconded the motion. Before voting took place, Aaron Loudermilk and David Thompson chose to abstain from the vote. President Thacker said it would still take four yes votes in order for the motion to pass. Upon a voice vote of 5-0, the motion unanimously passed.

xvi. Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2023-25: LIT/Public Safety – Mental Health America

A presentation about this matter had been given at the Sunshine Meeting by Myra Wilkey. Marie Theisz said she wanted to discuss funding. She was supportive of this but she felt that this would be better to be requested out of ARP funding rather than LIT/Public Safety. This request was briefly summarized. David Thompson said the Council had asked at the Sunshine Meeting that Ms. Wilkey provide them with copies of her letters of support previously talked about. Ms. Wilkey asked that this matter be tabled in order to review her funding. She believed she had some other sources that were previously unknown. Upon being asked if it would allow her enough time if this matter was tabled until the April meeting, Ms. Wilkey replied that she believed it would. Marie Theisz made a motion to table Additional Appropriation 2023-25 until the April meeting. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

xvii. Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2023-26: ARP Grant Fund – Culvert & Drainage Projects

This was withdrawn by the Commissioners until a later date.

Adjournment

Before adjourning, President Thacker said that in future meetings, he is requesting that public comments be moved to the end of the meeting. RESOLUTION NO. 2023-06 RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF VIGO COUNTY, INDIANA IN SUPPORT OF A PLAN FOR DISBURSEMENT OF AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN FUNDS.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners ("The Commissioners") of Vigo County, Indiana has put together a proposed plan for disbursement of American Rescue Plan Act funds ("ARPA") that Vigo County, Indiana has received; and

WHEREAS The Commissioners desire to submit said proposed plan to the County Council of Vigo County, Indiana for approval; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the County Council of Vigo County, Indiana that: the County Council of Vigo County is in support of the following plan for disbursement of ARPA funds:

Housing - \$5,000,000

The COVID-19 pandemic kickstarted a major housing demand, as many were fleeing urban areas and finding new quality of life opportunities in the Midwest. This increased demand of housing continues, and it is evident in Vigo County more than ever. In Vigo County, we have an aging housing stock, a mismatch of supply and demand, and very little new home construction. This, paired with an increase in median listing prices for homes jumping more than 20% and rent increasing, home ownership is coming out of reach for more and more people. The Vigo County Commissioners are requesting \$5 million for programming, potential incentives for developers, and matching funds for potential funding opportunities that might be coming down the pipeline. The state's recently conducted housing study indicates a statewide issue and the need for initiative in and around communities. And local housing experts are communicating this same concern for more opportunities.

READI – Description

The Wabash River RDA received \$20 million in funding from the State through the Regional Economic Acceleration and Development Initiative, also known as READI. Due to the matching component, this \$20 million dollar incentivizes approximately 100 million dollars in investments throughout the 6-county region. Nearly half of that investment is right here in Vigo County – projects promoting quality of life, tourism, workforce training, and talent attraction and retention. The Commissioners see a great benefit in providing support in the match requirements to ensure these projects move forward, giving these projects that extra step that they need to move across the finish line.

ISU Early Childhood Learning Center - \$3,000,000

Childcare. Through various studies within West Central Indiana, we know that this issue of childcare and what it means for our workforce, is an important topic. The See You in Terre Haute Vigo County 2025 Community Plan, the Resilient study conducted by Thrive West

Central, the great work that Chances and Service for Youth has done in data collection, various workforce roundtable discussion with manufacturers, community leaders, and more — all of this data points to a need. A need that this project - the Indiana State University Early Childhood Learning Center - aims to fill. This READI project addresses one of our number 1 concerns as a community and as a region. Our small businesses are asking for help. Our manufacturers are asking for help. This is a timely concern. It's getting people back into the workforce. We've had the opportunity to address the manufacturers in a facilitated conversation aside from these other platforms, surveys, and data points, and we've heard directly from the manufacturers. The Commissioners request \$3 million dollars for the ISU Early Childhood Learning Center, recognizing that this is a comprehensive early childhood learning project that has the opportunity to impact anyone in Vigo County that could use these services. ISU is in a unique position to expand these services with their early childhood learning education programming and the space that they have to dedicate to this initiative.

Terre Haute Children's Museum - \$75,000

We saw the Museum work through some major hardships, pivot, recover, and continue to be a vital part of our downtown community. As we have expanded Downtown Terre Haute with the Terre Haute Convention Center, the upcoming Larry Bird Museum, and all of the other museums within walking distance of our downtown development, this provides another opportunity for us to sell Downtown as it relates to giving families a place to enjoy outdoor activities within their visit to the Terre Haute Children's Museum. The Commissioners request \$75,000 to support the Terre Haute Children's Museum's feasibility study to determine the best plan of action for closing 8th Street and turning that into an interactive outdoor play space for children and their families. This project is a perfect example of setting ourselves up for success to pursue other funding opportunities and mechanisms, and even creating an opportunity for READI 2.0 funding to help accomplish this bigger initiative moving forward.

West Central Business Hub - \$750,000

The West Central Business Hub will create a comprehensive business resource or one-stop-shop for all business-related development in the West Central Indiana region. Composed of multiple organizational partners in the region, each provides expertise and services to help businesses grow and prosper. Currently, the hub exists only as an online presence. In 2020, the COVID-19 Emergency Response Team was created under the heading of the West Central Business Hub to provide local businesses with immediate answers to their questions and connect business leaders with available resources. Given its success during the pandemic, the need for a physical presence has quickly arisen. Organizations that will be located in the Business Hub include Terre Haute Chamber of Commerce, Terre Haute Economic Development Corporation, Terre Haute Convention & Visitors Bureau satellite location, Launch Terre Haute, WorkOne of West Central Indiana, and office hours for West Central Indiana Small Business Development Center. The Hulman Building has been identified as the location for the business hub due to its convenient, accessible location downtown and is large enough to accommodate all interested partners. The Commissioners request \$750,000 to transform this space into the West Central Business Hub's permanent home. Since Regional Cities funding established a push for regionalism, we have learned that those that are most competitive have found ways to work together under one

umbrella, under one roof. What this project is going to do is allow those entities who have interest in Terre Haute, Vigo County, who have interest in West Central Indiana to walk in one door and be able to have those resources all together. This project puts us in a place where we can be more competitive, where we can be more efficient, where we can be more business friendly, to those interested in doing business in Terre Haute and Vigo County.

Saint Mary-of-the-Woods College - \$500,000

Saint Mary-of-the-Woods College is known for its equine programming. Not just the equine facility but being the only equine program in Indiana to offer a Bachelor of Science degree in equine studies, and one of approximately 20 equestrian colleges in the U.S. to offer a Bachelor of Science degree in equine studies. In addition to that, they continue to be one of the most competitive institutions not just in Indiana, not just in the Midwest, but nationally in equine sports. SMWC competes in an average of 23 shows per year with up to 8 of those being on site, bringing teams, coaches, show personnel and audiences from a number of other states to West Central Indiana. The proposed Equine Event Center will further establish West Central Indiana as Indiana's leader in equine events. They have really put a spotlight and on Terre Haute, Vigo County and West Central Indiana in a really unique way right there in Western Vigo County. They have been looking at ways in which they can utilize this best asset that they bring to the community to benefit West Central Indiana, to benefit our tourism numbers, to make sure that we are looking at new ways to bring people to our community outside of traditional tourism. This facility will allow them to do that, as it will enhance the athletic offerings at SMWC, making it more competitive in attracting talent, competitors, families, and sports industry experts to the region. The Commissioners request \$500,000 to contribute toward the first phase of the larger project of Saint Mary-of-the-Woods College Equine Facility. SMWC's goal is, over the course of the next few years, to become a very intentional place for people to consider when they're looking to do these types of competitions. We believe that as we grow the tourism market in West Central Indiana that the equine space at Saint Mary-of-the-Woods College could be unique to Terre Haute and Vigo County and serve as an amazing asset.

Rose-Hulman Ventures - \$500,000

For 20 years, Rose-Hulman Ventures (RHV) has fueled innovation and economic growth in Indiana. Led by a team of highly experienced engineers, software developers, designers, and supported by student interns, RHV harnesses the power and resources of Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology (RHIT) to bring new ideas to life. RHV is a hub for innovation in which students have the opportunity to work with industry experts and businesses in developing prototypes, software, conceptualizing ideas and developing them to into real, tangible solutions. RHV has served over 200 organizations across the nation from right here in Vigo County. The Vigo County Commissioners are requesting \$500,000 to help in the relocation of RHV from their current site to the 46/42 intersection. RHV is currently located 6 miles off of Rose's main campus on a beautiful 100-acre campus on the southeast side of the community, limiting immediate access to crucial campus resources and interaction with students and Rose faculty. Through this project, Rose will construct a new campus for RHV and design a space allowing students to have more direct access and capabilities of interacting with these projects. This leads students to have more access in terms of building space and square footage and

more intentional time for their projects, understanding that as students, they have little time to spend to outside of the classroom. This project connects their work and experience at RHV to their course curriculum in a more fluid, intentional way and eliminates their commute times to Rose-Hulman. RHV's new space will house all its current business units in addition to new units such as a Civil Engineering Test Lab, a Biology Lab, a Prototyping Lab, Test Engineering, and Applied Optics. These new features will allow RHV to increase its capabilities, offerings, reach, and impact for its students and the businesses it serves. The more these students have handson experience, the more likely we can retain them. Not only is this essential for the student experience and growth of ventures, but it positions RHV at in the heart of the community spearing innovation and growth for our local economy. With a beautifully designed architectural cornerstone in our 46 corridors, this will position RHV directly in the midst of our community, allowing our local businesses to engage with their team and utilize their capabilities often. The infrastructure supports this movement and with the continued growth of the 46 corridors, this project allows RHIT to put Vigo County on the map in a new way. This will be one of the most progressive technological hubs in Indiana, allowing RHIT and Vigo County to be the face of technology in ways we haven't before. Even with Rose-Hulman's continued growth and advancement, right now RHV feels a little further away from our community. This will put it in a place we believe it truly belongs to best serve the community, the students, businesses and beyond.

Swope Art Museum - \$250,000

The Swope has certainly come to be the cornerstone of Wabash Valley art and culture. So much so that the museum has been coined as one of the "10 best places to see art in smaller cities" by USA Today. The Swope serves a national audience, with most attendees coming from a 75-mile radius of Vigo County with an average of 13,000 visitors per year. One of the Swope's pride points is its free admission, allowing everyone access to great art for all. With READI, the Wabash River RDA invited all museums in the community to play a role in how our region's proposal was put together. With that being said, the RDA and the Commissioners were happy to see that the Swope Art Museum wanted to continue their growth. And with this growth trajectory, the Swope has implemented a capital campaign. Today, the Commissioners are requesting \$250,000 to support the campaign in 2 major ways. Creating a more accessible Swope Art Museum so that people with disabilities can access all aspects of the museum in its entirety safely and comfortably. The Swope resides in a 1901 three-story, 30,000-square-foot building listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The building and its amenities have withstood the test of time. Today, the museum is in need of improved physical access for all, especially electrified door access and a modern elevator to replace the four-passenger elevator currently in use, which, by the way, is one of Indiana's oldest operating elevators built in 1948! An updated fire stair tower would also grant full use of the third floor that overlooks much of downtown Terre Haute, creating a functional and refurbished third floor. The renovated space will serve as a flexible space for art classes for all ages, starting as young as two years old, along with a space for gatherings, fundraisers, workshops, and more. The vision here is to have a multi-use facility with restrooms and a catering kitchen that would complement downtown's hospitality industry.

Vigo County Juvenile Justice Center - \$2,000,000

Increasing programming for incarcerated youth is really about decreasing recidivism in our jails and being able to support kids at a younger age by helping them with programs and services. There have been many conversations relating to the jail and how to move forward better than we have in the past. Providing funds that support the Vigo County Juvenile Justice Center is a small step in the right direction. Currently, engineering firm DLZ is finalizing a study on what the Vigo County Juvenile Justice Center might need to better support our youth. Whether that be increased bed capacity (currently having 19 secure beds), addressing the need for LGBTQ+ needs (as there is no LGBTQ+ wing in the facility), a separate wing to house those who are charged as adults, and a medical wing. Currently, the facility does not have a medical wing or pod to separate kids who are sick which can increase the potential spread of diseases like COVID-19. The Vigo County Commissioners are requesting \$2 million dollars to support the Vigo County Juvenile Justice Center on the programming, resources, mental health services and other services to best serve our youth. Our Juvenile Justice Center is 1 of only 13 juvenile centers in the state. Because of that, we have kids from over 30 counties across the state who utilize the Juvenile Center right here in Vigo County. This facility impacts many children, not solely Vigo County kids. This is about youth programming, mental health programing, benchmarking other like communities and juvenile centers, and looking at how other communities are addressing these opportunities so we can continue resourcing our youth and help them become productive members of society.

Infrastructure - \$2,100,000

The Vigo County Commissioners are requesting \$2.1 million to help address 17 projects that Larry Robbins, our County Engineer, has identified as projects that need priority action.

Terre Haute Humane Society - \$250,000

The Commissioners, in partnership with the City of Terre Haute, have been having conversations on how to best help the Terre Haute Humane Society support the Vigo County Sheriff's Office and the Terre Haute Police Department as they bring in animals to the shelter. In doing so, the Commissioners, request \$250,000 in partnership with the City of Terre Haute to help the Humane Society build onto the back area of their facility so that the Vigo County Sheriff's Office and Terre Haute Police Department have their own direct access location to bring in those furry friends to who need support. This will provide more efficiency for the Sheriff's Office and Police Department, so they have their own designated area to quickly transport, drop off, and continue about their duties where needed. The Humane Society continues to be in need of more space. When Code Enforcement, the Sheriff's office, the Police Department, or any citizen within the community calls and asks for space to bring in an animal, space and resources continuously becomes a concern to serve and house these animals. Oftentimes, they physically don't have room, and some have to be turned away. Our goal is to help resource the Humane Society so that they can have more direct access to be able to handle these matters in a more efficient and humane way.

Small Businesses and Non-Profits - \$1,000,000

During the pandemic, our nonprofit and business community were all hit very hard. We feel like it is in the best interest of our nonprofit community, daycare and business community that we don't leave them behind in regard to the opportunity to help them in any way that we can. If there were nonprofits and businesses that were negatively impacted by COVID-19, working with the United Way of the Wabash Valley and potentially others, we would like to form a partnership that would allow Vigo County to participate in ways that could help those that did not receive COVID-19 relief. We are going to prioritize those that did not receive COVID-19 relief to make sure that they are moving in the right direction. Essentially no nonprofit and no small business left behind is the concept. The Commissioners request 1 million dollars for nonprofit, daycare and small business support. To do this, we understand that we are going to have to develop grants and programs that help us with the prioritization. We understand that the county government is not in a position to lead grant programming, but we do have those in the community like United Way of the Wabash Valley that can. This is their area of expertise. The goal here is to allow them to work with us and the Council to make sure that there are things in place if they are suffering and did not receive funding. If they did not receive this assistance, we want to be able to help them move on and continue to hopefully sustain and thrive in Vigo County.

Happiness Bag - \$750,000

Happiness Bag is the Wabash Valley's ONLY recreational and educational facility for individuals with disabilities. They just recently celebrated their 50th anniversary. You may know Happiness Bag through their training and coordination of the Vigo County Special Olympics, but they really do so much more than that. Through their unique services, Happiness Bag directly serves about 250 individuals, ages 5 and up. They serve about 100 individuals daily through their Medicaid waiver programs including the adult day program, which is the service that utilizes the entire facility the most. They have been in their current building since 1997 and are experiencing a great need to expand their facility. Last July, they broke ground to kick off a fundraising initiative for an expansion plan that was approved in 2020. In fact, fundraising had been ongoing since 2017 when the need for a new facility became apparent. The Commissioners request \$750,000 to support Happiness Bag's expanded facility. This new facility expansion will be about 11,000 sq. ft. (nearly the size of the current facility). It will allow Happiness Bag to potentially hire 10-12 full time and part time employees, expand the number individuals they will serve in daily programs, reduce limitations on sports and recreational activities, provide more options for 3-7-year-olds through early interventions and early sport introductions, and really just allow them to continue to provide excellent recreational and educational programming for individuals with disabilities – a much needed resource for our community.

Other - \$4,600,000

Possible request of \$250,000 for Mullen Flats Housing project. The money would support 42 very low-income housing units.

Note – This is a plan or simply a guide. Projects and plans are subject to change along the way.
