# What are the 10 Key Components to Veterans Court?

- 1. Veterans Court integrates treatment services for issues, such as mental, alcohol and other drug treatment services, with justice system case processing.
- 2. Using a non-adversarial approach promoting public safety, while protecting the participant's due process rights.
- 3. Eligible participants are identified early and promptly placed in the Veterans Court program.
- Veterans Court provides access to a continuum mental, alcohol, and drug treatment and rehabilitation services.
- 5. Abstinence from alcohol and other drugs is monitored by frequent testing.
- A coordinated strategy governs Veterans Court responses to participants' compliance.
- 7. Ongoing judicial interaction with each Veterans Court participant is essential.
- 8. Monitoring and evaluation measure the achievement of program goals and gauge effectiveness.
- Continuing interdisciplinary education promotes effective Veterans Court planning, implementation and operations.
- Forging partnerships among Veterans Court, public agencies and communitybased organizations generates local support and enhances Veterans Court effectiveness.

#### What is Veterans Court?

Veterans Court is a collaboration of numerous agencies: the Court, the VA, the Public Defender's Office, the Prosecutor's office, the Probation Department, Community Corrections, and many other community partners. Through collaboration, the various agencies have established a program in which a Veteran's needs are better met through treatment intervention rather than incarceration.

Assisting the court is a team of volunteer veteran, active duty, and guard/reserve mentors. The mentor is critical to the success of this program and fosters a "can do" attitude in the veteran, and establishes that the veteran is not alone.

#### Mission Statement

The mission of Vigo County Veterans Treatment Court is to provide an inter-agency, collaborative, non-adversarial program for Veterans facing criminal charges and suffering from PTSD or other psychological and/or substance abuse problems.

## **Admission Criteria**

Veteran defendants facing non-violent misdemeanor and felony charges who need substance abuse and/or mental health treatment can apply.
