#### Pledge of Allegiance

President Aaron Loudermilk called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### Calling of the roll

**Present:** Travis Norris, Marie Theisz, Don Morris, Vicki Weger, Brenda Wilson, David Thompson, Aaron Loudermilk.

#### Correcting of the journal of the preceding meeting if needed

April 6 2021 Sunshine Meeting April 13, 2021 Regular Meeting

There were no corrections to the minutes of the April 6 Sunshine Meeting. David Thompson made a motion to approve the minutes of the Sunshine Meeting. Travis Norris seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote, the motion passed with a vote of 7-0.

There were no corrections to the minutes of the April 13 regular meeting. David Thompson made a motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting. Brenda Wilson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote, the motion passed with a vote of 7-0.

#### **Public Comment**

There were none.

#### Communications from elected officials, other officials or agencies of the County

Annual Report of Redevelopment Commission was received from the Redevelopment Commission. It is appropriate to receive these as a matter of record and no action needs to be taken.

#### Reports from standing committee(s)

There were none.

#### Ordinances relating to appropriations

i. ROC 2021-016, Final Action Regarding Resolution 2021-03: Final Reading of Duke Energy Renewables Solar, LLC

This matter was approved at the April meeting of the Council, however, Council was provided tonight with a Form SB-1 and a worksheet showing different scenarios by Council Administrator Kylissa Miller, the lead sheet of which shows potential tax abatement options/schedules. A document prepared by Tyler Coon with Duke Energy that was sent today to President Loudermilk was also given to Council members just

before the start of the meeting which set forth a 10-year personal property tax abatement schedule and a 7-year personal property tax abatement schedule which was modified. The modified schedule is different than what is shown on the worksheet prepared by Ms. Miller. The meeting was then opened for additional questions regarding this material. A lengthy discussion took place during which it was brought out that Duke Energy Renewables Solar would be amenable to the modified 7-year schedule (which schedule is different than the state standard) or the standard 10-year schedule. It was clarified that this request was for personal property tax abatement only and not real property. It was also noted that in states where abatements were not granted, the proposed project did not go forward. It was also noted that this project involved both Vigo and Sullivan Counties. If an abatement was not approved in Sullivan County, the result would be that the largest amount land for the project would be in Vigo County but it would not derail the project. On the other hand, if Sullivan County granted an abatement and Vigo County did not, the most land for the project would then switch to Sullivan County. Don Morris made a motion to amend the Resolution 2021-03 to a 7-year modified schedule personal property tax abatement. Brenda Wilson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the amendment passed. Brenda Wilson moved to approve the 7-year modified schedule personal property tax abatement as amended. Don Morris seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

# ii. ROC 2021-18 Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-09: Drug Free Community

This is a request to appropriate \$56,693 into Operating Expenses for the Drug Free Community Fund. Brandon Halleck explained that this program is funded by court user fees paid via the Vigo County Clerk's Office and City of Terre Haute Clerk's office. 75% of the fees stay here locally and 25% goes back to the Criminal Justice Institute. At a local level, these funds are then granted out in three categories: prevention, treatment, and law enforcement. So each year, the funds have to be appropriated out and the funding body is the County Council. The Council had no additional questions. Marie Theisz made a motion to approve Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-09. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

# iii. ROC 2021-019, Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-10: EDIT/Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-15: County General

This Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-10 is a request for an appropriation in the amount of \$170,000 to build restroom facilities to be located at the trailhead of Ruble Park on land owned by Ivy Tech which will be maintained by Ivy Tech after construction. This was a request for appropriation from EDIT **OR** from County General (Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-15). This was discussed at length at the Sunshine Meeting. The decision tonight is whether to move forward and, if so, from which fund the money will be appropriated. Councilwoman Vicki Weger indicated that after discussion with the Auditor's Office, she felt that the funds should be used from County General rather than EDIT. The balances of each fund, along with projections through the end of this year, were discussed along with the project itself. It was clarified

that the facility was being built with county money on land owned by Ivy Tech and would be maintained by Ivy Tech. Technically, it would be owned by Ivy Tech but is being looked at as a community resource for use by all members of the community. A memorandum of understanding ("MOU") is being prepared and although it was hoped that it would be ready for presentation to the meeting tonight, review and approval by the attorneys preparing same was not complete. It should be completed in the next week or so. Commissioner Brendan Kearns assured the Council that if this appropriation is approved tonight, the County Attorneys will be consulted for approval by the County and if agreeable terms cannot be reached by the parties, the Commissioners would not sign it and the project would die. It was also noted that if in the future something would happen and Ivy Tech closed/terminated being a community college, the facility could be moved from the premises. Discussion continued. Marie Theisz made a motion to use EDIT funds, which would be Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-10, to fund this \$170,000.00 request. There was no second to the motion and the motion died. Don Morris made a motion to use County General funds, which would be Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-15, to fund this request for \$170,000.00. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote, voting was as follows: Travis Norris – aye; Marie Theisz – aye; Don Morris – aye; Vicki Weger – aye; Brenda Wilson – aye; David Thompson – nay; Aaron Loudermilk – nay. With a vote of 5-2, motion passes.

# iv. ROC 2021-020, Resolution of Re-Allocation of Existing Appropriation 2021-04: Juvenile Justice Center

This was discussed at length at the Sunshine Meeting and is request to transfer funds from the Food Line item to the Vehicle Line item in the amount of \$31,000.00. The Council had no further questions. David Thompson made a motion to approve Resolution of Re-Allocation of Existing Appropriation 2021-04. Brenda Wilson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

## v. ROC 2021-021, Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-11: Juvenile Justice Center

This was discussed at length at the Sunshine Meeting and is a request for an additional appropriation for building repair and for locks, audio and video. Brenda Wilson questioned whether Norm Loudermilk, Executive Director, had asked the Commissioners to fund any of these repairs. Mr. Loudermilk replied in the negative due to the fact that there are several large building repair expenditures he was going to be requesting from the Commissioners and he thought it would be prudent to use some of his non-reverting funds (which are not taxpayer dollars) for some of the smaller ticket repairs. When this fund was established last year by the Commissioners, it was with the understanding that they could be requested to be used for building repairs, among other things. There was a lengthy discussion. Brenda Wilson made a motion to amend Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-011 Juvenile Justice Center Non-Reverting Fund subcategory 4959.35450.000.0000 Building Repair in the amount of \$65,760 be reduced to \$35,760. Lacking a second to the motion, the motion died. David Thompson made a motion to approve Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-11 as presented. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote, voting was as follows: Travis Norris – nay;

Marie Theisz – aye; Don Morris – aye; Vicki Weger – aye; Brenda Wilson – nay; David Thompson – aye; Aaron Loudermilk – aye. With a vote of 5-2, motion passes.

# vi. ROC 2021-022, Salary Ordinance 2021-12: Juvenile Justice Center

This matter was discussed at length at the Sunshine Meeting. Norm Loudermilk, Executive Director, advised that he wished to withdraw his request for additional appropriation to fund this Salary Ordinance due to the fact that he had gone over his budget and felt that he currently had enough funds in his budget to cover the salaries of two additional full time detention officers. He would only need the Council to approve the addition of two full-time detention officers. There was a discussion regarding salary classification which was determined to be Civilian Pole A. It was noted that the fund set forth in Section 2 of this Salary Ordinance needed to be corrected. Don Morris made a motion to amend Section 2 of Salary Ordinance 2021-12 from "Juvenile Justice Center" to "County General Fund" and to add "Civilian Pole A" as the salary classification for the addition of two detention officers. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved. Don Morris made a motion to approve Amended Salary Ordinance 2021-12. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved.

# vii. ROC 2021-022, Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-12: Juvenile Justice Center

This Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-12 was withdrawn.

# viii. ROC 2021-023, Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-13: Public Defenders

This Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-13 was for the purchase of a vehicle. This was discussed at length at the Sunshine Meeting. The Public Defender's Office has notified that the payout for this vehicle will be \$10,271 rather than the \$12,000 requested. President Loudermilk advised that the request could be vote on as is it could be amended to reduce the amount. Also, the Fund name needed to be corrected in Section 1. Brenda Wilson made a motion to amend Section 1 of Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-13 to reflect the correct Fund name of "Public Defender Supplemental Fund" and the amount being requested reduced to \$10,271. David Thompson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved. Brenda Wilson made a motion to approve Amended Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-13. Don Morris seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved.

# ix. ROC 2021-024, Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-14: Homeland Security Fund

This Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-14 is being requested for the purchase of a vehicle and was discussed at length at the Sunshine Meeting. The Council had no further questions. Travis Norris made a motion to amend the name of the Fund in Section 1 to "Homeland Security Fund". Brenda Wilson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed. Brenda Wilson made a motion to

approve Amended Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-14. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved.

## x. ROC 2021-025, Additional Appropriation 2021-16: Road Closure Fund

This Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-16 is being requested from the Road Closure Fund in order to purchase a flat bed semi-trailer and close out this fund. The Council had no further questions. Vicki Weger made a motion to approve Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-16. David Thompson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

# xi. ROC 2021-026, Salary Ordinance 2021-13: Vigo County Health Department

This Salary Ordinance 2021-13 was a request to increase the salary of the Environmental Health Supervisor. This request was discussed at length at the Sunshine Meeting. Kara Wright, HR Director, was present and asked to clarify to the Council that the amount of increase requested inadvertently included longevity pay in the amount. The actual request should have been for an increase to \$48,900 rather than \$51,000. Ms. Wright said she had researched surrounding counties' pay rates for jobs with similar duties and the average of 6 counties (with 3 paying more and 3 paying less than Vigo County) was \$47,770.60. Adding in a cost of living increase would make the total around \$49,000. So the ask is in a proper amount. However, Ms. Wright felt that rather than just increasing the salary for the particular employee, that another pay grade should be created in order to not run into this same situation down the road. The current pay grade for this position is Pat B. This could create a situation in the future where the person appointed to this position would be making the exact same pay rate as the people she was supervising (which is the current situation). The next step up would be Exec A which would then put the person making as much as the department head. Neither situation would be fair to anyone. Ms. Wright felt that a new category, Pat C, should be created that would be somewhere in between Pat B and Exec A to solve this problem. There was a lengthy discussion. It was felt that the current employee should definitely be making more than the people she supervised. However, the Council really wanted to see a report from an independent third party, typically being Wilson, Irwin & Scheele ("WIS"), before any decision is made. Brenda Wilson made a motion to table Salary Ordinance 2021-13 and Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-17 until the June 8 meeting in order to be able to obtain and review the information to be provided by WIS. David Thompson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed

# xii. ROC 2021-026, Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-17: Vigo County Health Department

This Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2021-17 goes along with Salary Ordinance 2021-13 and was tabled until the June 8 meeting.

# xiii. ROC 2021-027: Public Safety LIT Options for Distribution to Units for Distribution in 2022

The distribution of the Public Safety LIT Options to Units for Distribution in 2022 using the 65% run ratio/35% levy ratio was introduced at the Sunshine Meeting. These percentages are what have been agreed to and used since these distributions originated. Aaron Loudermilk reminded Council members that once these distributions are decided, the Units are then required to submit a letter by July 1 of this year for the approved use of the funds. Don Morris made a motion to approve the Public Safety LIT Options for Distribution to Units for Distribution in 2022 using the 65%-35% split. Brenda Wilson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion unanimously passed.

#### FINAL ACTION BY COUNTY COUNCIL OF VIGO COUNTY, INDIANA REGARDING RESOLUTION NO. 2021- 03

#### (Personal Property)

WHEREAS, the County Council of Vigo County, Indiana, adopted Resolution 2021-03 on April 13, 2021, a resolution declaring an Economic Revitalization Area for the purpose of a ten (10) year personal property tax abatement for Duke Energy Renewables Solar, LLC, an Indiana limited liability company ("Petitioner") for the development of a utility-scale solar electric generation facility located on State Road 246 on approximately 896.38 acres of land in Pierson and Linton Townships, Vigo County;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Indiana Law, Petitioner has published notice of the adoption and substance of that Resolution including a description of the affected area and notice that a description of the affected area is available for inspection in the office of the county assessor and further stating a date on which the County Council would receive and hear remonstrances and objections and take final action and consider the adoptions of the waivers, and has provided proof of publication of such notice;

WHEREAS, the County Council has conducted the hearing as required by law and has received no remonstrances or objections to designation of the affected area as a revitalization area or to approval of the Statement of Benefits;

WHEREAS, a petition for ten (10) year real and personal property tax abatement has been filed with the County Council of Vigo County, Indiana requesting that the real property described therein be designated an Economic Revitalization Area for purposes of real and personal property tax abatement; and

WHEREAS, said matter is before the County Council for final action under Indiana Law; and

WHEREAS, the County Council has received and examined, before such hearing, a Statement of Benefits on the form prescribed by the Department of Local Government Finance and proper application for designation and has heard all appropriate evidence about the proposed project and has found and does find:

- 1. That the estimate of the cost of the new manufacturing equipment is reasonable for equipment of that type; and,
- 2. That the estimate of individuals who will be employed as a result of the installation of the new manufacturing equipment and the proposed project can reasonably be expected from the proposed project; and,

- 3. That the estimate of annual salaries of those individuals who will be employed can reasonably be expected to result from the proposed installation of the new manufacturing equipment and the proposed project; and,
- 4. That the benefits described in Petitioner's Statement of Benefits can reasonably be expected to result from the proposed installation of new manufacturing equipment and the proposed project; and,
  - 5. That the totality of benefits is sufficient to justify the deduction; and,
- 6. That all qualifications for establishing an economic revitalization area have been met.

NOW, THEREFORE, for final action on Resolution 2021-03, the County Council of Vigo County, Indiana, FINDS, DETERMINES, AND RESOLVES that:

- 1. All the requirements for designation of the real estate described in Resolution 2021-03 as an Economic Revitalization Area have been met, these findings are true, and all information required to be submitted has been submitted in proper form; and,
- 2. Resolution 2021-03 is in all respects confirmed and approved (as modified to incorporate therein this final action) and that the benefits of the proposed redevelopment are sufficient to justify personal property tax abatement over a 7-year deduction period under Indiana statutes for the proposed acquisition of the equipment described in the Statement of Benefits of Petitioner and the deduction for the proposed project and acquisition of the equipment and the Statement of Benefits submitted are approved and the County Council authorizes and directs endorsement of said Statement to show such approval and that the real estate described in Resolution 2021-03 is declared an economic revitalization area for the purposes of personal property tax abatement over a 7-year deduction period and the real estate is hereby designated as an Economic Revitalization Area under I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-1, et seq. and Petitioner is entitled to personal property tax deduction over a 7-year deduction period in connection with the proposed acquisition of the new manufacturing equipment; and,
- 3. Said Resolution supplements any other designation of the real estate as a Revitalization Area or other similar designation; and,
- 4. This Final Action, findings and confirmation of Resolution 2021-03 shall be incorporated in and be a part of Resolution 2021-03.
