

Employee shall report to person in charge if they experience the following:

- 1) diarrhea
- 2) fever
- 3) vomiting
- 4) jaundice
- 5) sore throat with fever
- 6) a lesion containing pus, such as a boil or infected wound that is open or draining on the hands or wrists or other exposed parts of the body
- 7) suspected of causing or being exposed to a confirmed disease outbreak caused by Salmonella spp., Shigella spp., Shiga toxin-producing Escherichia coli, Hepatitis A virus or Norovirus
- 8) living in the same household as a person who is diagnosed with a disease caused by Salmonella spp., Shigella spp., Shiga toxin-producing Escherichia coli, Hepatitis A virus or Norovirus

The person-in-charge shall exclude the employee from the establishment if:

- 1) employee experiences vomiting and/or diarrhea
- 2) employee is diagnosed with a disease caused by Salmonella spp., Shigella spp., Shiga toxin-producing Escherichia coli, Hepatitis A virus or Norovirus
- 2) employee is jaundiced, or if the onset of jaundice occurred within the last 7 days

The person-in-charge shall restrict an employee from working with food, equipment, utensils and linens and unwrapped single-service and single-use articles if the employee:

- 1) has sore throat with fever
- 2) is not experiencing symptoms of acute gastroenteritis but has a stool that yields a specimen culture that is positive for Salmonella spp., Shigella spp., or Shiga toxin-producing Escherichia coli
- 3) has a lesion containing pus, such as a boil or infected wound, that is open or draining and is not covered with an impermeable cover
